2. With **love (*Ahava*)** and **loyalty (*Ne'emanut*)**, Camp Kadimah fosters lifelong friendships and relationships.
3. Camp Kadimah encourages personal growth and independence. By instilling **confidence (*Bitachon*)** and **leadership (*Manhigut*)**, Camp Kadimah is a place where you can be the best version of yourself in a safe space.
4. Camp Kadimah encourages campers and staff to step outside their comfort zone by inspiring **curiosity (*Histakr'nut*)** and **creativity (*Yetzirah*)**.
5. Campers at Camp Kadimah are surrounded by positive Jewish role models who exemplify **righteousness (*Tzedek*)** and **sensibility (*Daat*)**.
6. Strong Jewish identities and relationships with Israel at Camp Kadimah emphasize the values of **social responsibility (*Achrayut*)** and notion that “**all of Israel is responsible for one another**” (*Kol Yisrael Areivim Zeh L'Zeh*).
