

GLANCING BACK

KADIMAH, holds a very special place in my heart which will never cease to exist. At times I wonder, and ask myself "Self, what are you doing here"?, but the answer is always close by In 1965 I came to Kadimah as a fresh, green, spunky camper, not knowing that it was only the beginning of many many more summers. Being a camper in Kadimah until 1970, there were many instances when I truly wondered what I kept coming back for. Those summers of years past, had the good and the bad, but it's kind of funny that now when I gaze back, I can't seem to remember the bad. Oh yah, there was the time when I got a dart in the side of my arm, and the time I lost canteen for a week; but now they all seem so trivial, and in fact they were trivial immediately after they happened.

In 1971 I began to realize that camp was present not only to have fun, but also to learn a little, in the hope that in the future I'll be able to do the same for others. That was my first summer in Camp Machar. It was the summer when "Everybody's Talking About This Chevra We're Feeling" was written, and this chevra is still felt by myself seven summers later. Machar was great for me; it offered fun, learning, maturity, and many other valueable assets which are essential in one's growth.

A new episode in my life began the summer of 72. Kadimah was no longer present and only the unfamiliar faces and environment of Camp Solelin was. I spent two summers there, and the faces became very familiar, but the environment and atmosphere never did. The fun was present, as was the learning, but there was something missing; this missing part is unexplained in words-only by feelings.

74 was the summer in which I finally arrived at Biluin, and Hadracha was learnt, or supposedly so. Many faces were the same as at Solelim, but the summer proved to the revitalization of my yearning to go back to Kadimah. I noticed my fellow Maritimers who I had gone to Kadimah with, were so different than my Solelim friends who were mostly from Ontario. Everyday at meals when songs would begin, it was the Atlantic kids with all the chevra, and enthusiasm. When "We are from Atlantic, the region that is best", was sung at the top of our lungs, a feeling went through me, the feeling was full of truth; the truth was that my region was the best. Maybe the region itself was no different from other regions, but the kids certainly were.

Leaving Kadinah in 71,I knew it was just to experience other Y.J. camps, and to find out about myself. Self did find out.75 I was back to where my summers all began. I was once again living all my talk from the previous few years. Puzzled, I questioned myself; "If Kadinah was so great to me, why did I go elsewhere" ?I know why, and it was quite evident that I didn't really know how to appreciate Kadinah, until I wasn't there. The summers of 75, and 76, I was senior councellor with scouting responsibilities, now I was finally in a position to help others learn, have fun, and appreciate camp; the camp that was so special to me. Something was missing... The kids were different, with different values, ideals, wants, and needs; Or were they? Maybe it was that I was just trying to do a little comparing with the past and the present, and the kids were exactly the same, and I was just in a different position; that being, I was the one looking on, and not looked at.

The past four summers that I've spent on staff and head staff have been important ones to me. I now can really understand why Kadimah is so very, very special to me and other Jewish kids from the Maritimes and other furthur away places.

Kadimah offers so much to everyone, and is more than just a camp.

Kadimah is a place to love, share, grow, learn to trust, learn about oneself and relate to others, create new friendships and relive old ones.

Kadimah is a place where we all learn to appreciate how lucky we are to be Jewish and have such a beautiful place to spend the summer.

Kadimah is everything and even a little bit more than one could expect to ever achieve in a summer

REFLECTIONS ON MY SECOND HOME

When I first stepped off the bus on that appointed day in a season long past, I was filled with mixed feelings of anticipation and excitement. Not quite nine years and yet never having attended a summer camp outside the city, porticularly one that lasted for such a long period of time, I did not know what to expect nor what I would experience once the iniatial homesickness wore off. It did not take me long to realize that being a Junior (the former counterpart to a gib) was at once fascinating and time consuming there was no time in the summer of ,70 to think about the security of home or friends left behind, because it was all here at kadimah - and more.

My second and last year in the youngest section of a camp of close to 250 people was unpredictably different. The novelty of being away from home and encountering a new situation, had worn off. At ten years of age, my eyes opened wide onto a world of 250 individuals full of spirit, zest and a general concern for maintaining a high pitch in both unity and friendship for six weeks of a year. For the first time I began to understand that Kadimah was shaping me into an awareness of my growing self; it was teaching me to be independent and individualistic and yet trusting of my newly established friends. Ut was producing in me the desire to extend myself, to share and live with others, feeling was being nurtured in my mind of what true friendship and consideration was something I could not have learn-

ed living at home every day of each year.

The next two summers passed all too quickly for me, camp was changing, just as I was: I moved into a new section entitled "goshrim" in 1972 and discovered the value of summer friendships which blossom into year round commitments. I began to understand that Kadimah was not a "filler" or an interval between the end of a school year and the commencement of the next. It was no longer a period of days which occupied my endless summer boredom nor a method by which my parents could liberate and therefore enjoy themselves. I was coming back to the same place each summer of my own free will, without the need of a parents sharp insistence. All this set the stage for the summer of 1973 - an unforgettable memory. Just turning twelve, I was cast into the oldest section of Kadimah amid the turmoil and onset of early adolescence. Tears and torment vexed our Saturday night post social discussions while laughter and levity colored the late night shenanigans, and nothing could match my pride when my team won my very first Hityashfut. It was a season when having a good friend or a great counsellor to share secrets and sorrows with, really mattered. Perhaps because I couls not return the following summer, I have always held that last Kadiamh year especially dear.

Thad always looked up to the Macharniks with They had the spirit, the unity and the friendship that both symbolized and nurtured our camp. When it was my turn to take on this responsibility for two summers, I found that I had been neither deceived nor disillusioned The effort came easily, the feeling was there. No pretense was neccessary, we sing, shouted -- clapped and cheered because we were Machar. Not a separate camp but a more mature It prepared me both pschoologigally and emotionally for my next step in the progression of Young Judea '77. I went off, timidly, to Bilium Canada. It was easy to adapt to life away from Kadimah because those from other camps and regions took readily to us; we were Rosh Va'ad Chevra, Hityashvut and Tarbut, we sang the loudest during the meals and we pulled the best kuntzes. Our mannerisms ideas and attitudes had been inspired by years of Kadimah experience.

This year I have observed Kadimah through a different window, I am no longer ignorant of the mechanisms and workings of this complicated machine, I now fully understand and appreciate the effort and enthusiasm which must go into tone summer. There is so much more to this comp than just what is seen at an evening program or a morning peula much more to appreciate.

And now? Now this Kadimah child has come full circle.







A Note from the Director

This is in no way intended to be a Director's report as I've decided that it is absolutely impossible to report on a total summer's experience in a few paragraphs. Instead I've decided to let you into my head and examine a few of my thoughts as camp draws to a close.

Eighteen consecutive summers at Young Judaea camps and the circle has finally closed. I've spent approximately 1080 days (3 full years) in total accumulated time at camps. Living together for a summer with a group of people is a very intense experience, Conflict, frustration, love, hate, anger, sadness, happiness — are emotions that are also intensified and you, campers and staff, have been forced to deal with these feelings because of the camp's very structure. The experience of observing and contributing to that growth has been most fulfilling. As for the future -- the 'intensity' of Kadimah-Machar '79 awaits us all.

WATERFRONT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Camp Kadimah is situated on two sides of Lake William. Joining the two halves is a bridge and connected to this bridge is the waterfront. It can therefore be accurately stated that the waterfront is the centre of Camp Kadimah, and that camp is based around the waterfront. Thus whatever happens on the waterfront strongly affects the rest of camp. Knowing this, the waterfront staff was determined to make the waterfront a fun place, a learning place, and most importantly a <u>safe</u> place.

Swim instruction was run much the same as in past years with Red Cross awards (juniors to seniors) and Royal Life awards (Lifesaving 1 to Bronze cross) being taught. We diverged from the Red Cross awards with our lower level swimmers and hels water orientation for them. The theory behind this is that younger children should become relaxed and confident in the water, so that when their endurance allows them to enter the deep end they will make better swimmers. Lifesaving classes were also offered as chugs (hobbies), but were poorly attended.

The implimentation of unit wide free swims increased the amount of fun that was had, and allowed the waterfront to be used to its full potential. Free swims are highly lifeguarded general swims for one section at a time, in which all the play things on the waterfront (paddleboards, inner tubes, unsinkables, slide and dive) can be used.

Waterskiing had it's usual successful summer with several of the better swimmers from the giborim section attempting, mostly successfully, to ski. The more advanced skiers continued to improve mastering such difficult treats as the flying one ski start. Even land lovers like Irwin Simon and Jeff Cohen were doing mean "leans" by summers end.

Sailing, now in its' third summer, was extremely successful. Under the direction of Bernie Soicher nearly two dozen campers learned how to sail out of the bay (and almost one dozen learned how to sail back). Seriously though, there are now several competent sailors in the Kochot and Machar section.

For the second summer in a row, Howard Conter has transformed the back lagoon into the home of the "Camp Kadimah Canoeing School". With the aid of several talented staff members the canoeing chug has again been much more a technical course and much less a "paddle around".

The waterfront was a very busy place this past summer. Much of the credit goes to the waterfront specialists: Bernie, Randy, Barry and Mitchel (our WI.T.-waterfront-staff in training), thank you. I'd also like to thank the many staff members who gave up their free time, came down to teach or lifeguard, thanks.

Have a good winter, take a swimming course - and always respect the water. Think Water Safety.

TZOFIUT REPORT







Gettong the boats ready during pre-camp was aided by the great Exra Eisner, who was able to repair all of the rudders. Thank you, Ezra.




Matthew and Howard lived in the waterfront cabin. It was a tough life for them. A stereo system, lamps, kettles, double mattresses. My heart just bled for them.



The joy in thought and activity demonstrated by enthusiasm for both drama and sports is a pleasure to watch.


Oneg Shabbat skits indicated that campers were sensitive to the world at large and Jewish existence even in the midst of an enjoyable and activity filled summer.





A SMALL BOY'S DREAM

(who becomes a big boy)

As I sit here and write about my camp experiences as a camper and a staff member, a tear flows from my eyes.

I started camp when I was eight years old and it was my first time away from home. Like all campers, their first year, who get homesick and want to go home on Visiting Day, I was no exception. I can remember on Visiting Day, when my parents left, that tears flowed from my eyes, but then came Maccabia, my first year of this competition. And then the last day of camp arrived and I saw people c rying about leaving but I couldn't understand why.

The next two years at camp were pretty well the same, always either getting into trouble or having a good time knowing that I was with Jewish people. This was different from my surroundings, as I come from a small town Glace Bay, with a Jewish population of

40 families.

Each year after leaving, always meeting new people from dif-

ferent parts of society.

And through the winter months, a communication was kept with friends through letter writing. Whenever through the year I would hear about Camp Kadimah, there would be a perk of my ears.

The following year I missed camp due to my Bar Mitzvah and this was a big change for me to stay in this little town for a summer. I was used to my routine of going to camp and this was a

letdown, not attending camp this summer.

After not going to camp the summer before, I was really looking forward to this next year. I was in Camp Machar - senior camp, and this was the top of the camp, in my eyes. My two years in Machar were my best years as a camper for reasons like, it was my first time I knew what it was about to have a Jewish girlfriend. Machar was a learning experience for me and this was the first time that I cried when camp was over. I looked back to when I was a Junior and was wondering why they were crying, but soon it occurred to me. Living with these people for 6 weeks, they become just like your own family.

The next year came the change for me at camp. I was a nonpaid staff member at 15, turning 16. At camp, this was a big treat for me and the people I lived with and the things I did were a treat within themselves. I went home that summer with my head above the

clouds.

In '75, I came back on Sports Staff. This was my first year that I was paid and what a treat to go home with a \$75 check in my pocket, not wanting to spend it all in one place.

By this time, camp was a part of my life and it was with me

12 months of the year, not two.

In '76, '77, I returned as Assistant Landsports Director and a few other odd jobs, like Fire Marshall and Head Security. Both these years, I finally reached it to the top. I was on Head Staff! When I was a Gib and just admired the head staff when they sat at head table... but here I was sitting there. Every time I looked at the Gibs and pictured myself there I wonder to myself, when they look at us, do they wonder the same? Well, I hope they do because I hope for their sake and the Atlantic Jewish Region that there is a Camp Kadimah.

In 1973. I attended Camp Kadimah as Sports Director but before deciding to attend, I kept asking myself if I was too old for this place. I wanted to think this but Camp Kadimah was just in my heart and I couldn't shrug it off like a pain. It was there, and it will be there to stay with me for a long time.

As the camp season comes to an end, I say to myself, is this the last for me? I hope it isn't the last for camp for a long time. This could be my last summer here but for damn well sure, it

won't be the last I think about camp.

I hope that every Gib's feelings are filled, the same way mine were.

In my closing, I will remind you of the first paragraph of the camp song and this should speak for Camp Kadimah's future, "As long as we all pull together, Kadimah will grow more and more."


Camp is now coming to an end, and before you know it, you'll be back to your hometown. Then when you get home, you could spend time with your friends, your family, or relatives.


MACHAR DAY




MACCABIA

SADIE HAWKINS DAY AT CAMP KADIMAH


