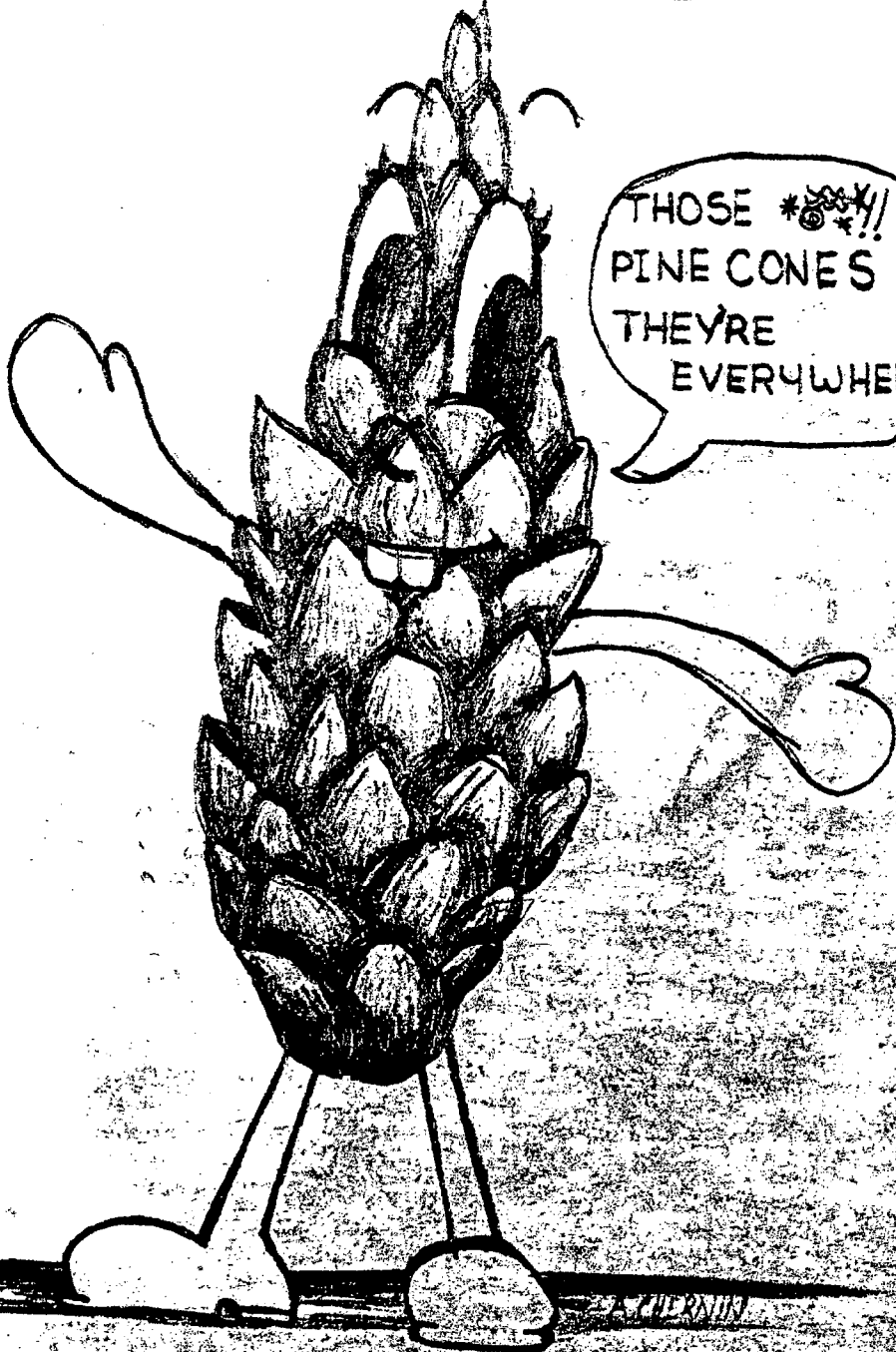


ASSISTANT CAMP DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Waterfront Directions Report

Camp Kadimah is situated on two sides of Lake William. Joining the two halves is a bridge and connects the two sides. This is the waterfront. It can therefore be stated that camp revolves around the waterfront. Knowing this the waterfront staff was determined to make the waterfront a fun place, a learning place, and most importantly a safe place.

Swim instruction at Kadimah was run much the same as in past years with Red Cross awards (juniors to seniors) and Royal Life awards (Life Saving I to Bronze Medallion) being offered. We diverged from the Red Cross Awards with our lower level swimmers (shallow ends) and held water orientation classes for them. In water orientation classes children learn how to be relaxed in the water and to respect the water thru games, free swims and personal attention.

For the first time in waterfront history a leaders course was offered to to Bronze Medallion swimmers in Machar for the training of swimming instructors. The leaders course offered nationally, through the Red Cross, Royal Life and "Y" swim programs is very vigorous and requires a great deal of time and effort from the candidates. Camp is no place to study or do homework, and I have a great deal of praise and respect for the students in the leaders course.

Waterskiing had its usual successful summer, though bad weather and special programming cut in on the number of classes one could have. The waterfront staff, conscious of their love of "ski mayim" are still looking for their fourth and fifth skies.

Sailing now in its fourth summer, was very successful under the keen direction of Bernie Soicher, who returned for his second summer as the sailing director. The donation of a fireball sailing boat to the fleet added new challenges for camps growing number of experienced sailors.

The canoeing program, run Leslie Rosoph, continued to be an educational experience. It was still lots of fun, as anyone who made it into the back lagoon or on a canoe hike will secretly tell you.

The waterfront was a busy place this last summer. Much of the credit goes to the waterfront specialists:

Bernie, Nancy, Leslie and Linda---thank you. I'd like to thank the many staff members and Macharnicks who gave up their free time and came down to teach or lifeguard. Thanks.

My First Summer At Kadimah

Being a newcomer to Camp Kadimah, I found myself entering a community steeped in tradition and fond memories. Much of Kadimah lives in the years that preceded 1979. The expressions, "I remember when..." or "in the past" or "When I was a camper" reappeared in many formal and informal discussions. It wasn't difficult to see the love and affection campers and staff feel for this Shangrila in Barss Corner. I was struck by the excitement and warm reunions that took place the first day the campers arrived! Little gibbies dragging their duffle bags to familiar cabin doorsteps as if this were home #2. It was a wonderful scenario.

I was fascinated by the stories of the family ties and discovering that "this one" from Montreal was "so and so's" cousin from Sydney. Portions of families seem to come back year after year making this generation of children the second or third-generation Kadimahites. I captured the distinct impression that without Kadimah some of these children would not exist, for it was the summer of '50 or '58 or '62 that their parents struck a romantic cord. The couples' names are etched on the cabin walls seemingly forever.

How terribly important Kadimah is in the scheme of Maritime Jewry! For if it were not for Camp Kadimah, where would the children from small, isolated cities experience the joy of Shabbat spent with fellow Jews or learn Hebrew songs and dances or participate in the strong Jewish aspects of maccabia? Perhaps their Jewish spirit would never be tapped and last forever. And least we mention those children from the larger Jewish centers; their identification is renewed and strengthened each summer as well.

To let this positive enthusiasm die then we all leave for our respective homes, would be unfortunatate, indeed. Many staff having gone through the ranks of Kadimah and Biluim, have given their leadership to Young Judaea, in an effort to further strengthen the "family ties". This is a positive step and one which needs to be supported and encouraged by each Maritime Community. An overall support system is available in Halifax that can reach out to communities that are interested, but need assistance in programming, leadership, financial aid or any other aspect of establishing a Y.J. group. I am available at all times, to lend my support.

The responsibility to continue the richness of Kadimah is in the hands of current staff who return home or go to college in the Atlantic region. You can contribute your time, talent and expertise that will help further our traditions. The theme for this summer was "Coming Home". By taking a piece of Kadimah back to our respective homes, we are doing a great deal to ensure that future generations of Jews will return home to Kadimah in years to come.

But who's to complain? At least I haven't been lonely. Staff, being uncomfortable in their cabins, found refuge on foam mattress spring beds, with freshly changed sheets and cool operating fans, away from the yells and the screams.

Thank-you Kadimah/Machar for giving me dishpan hands, sleepless nights, neurotic days, and for constantly depleting my supply of medications (as well as apple and orange juice, pop tarts, Harvest Crunch, toast and hot chocolate) and refinishing the floors with all daily coats of mud.
