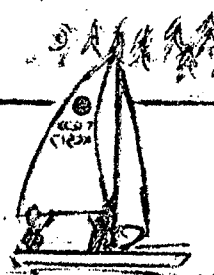
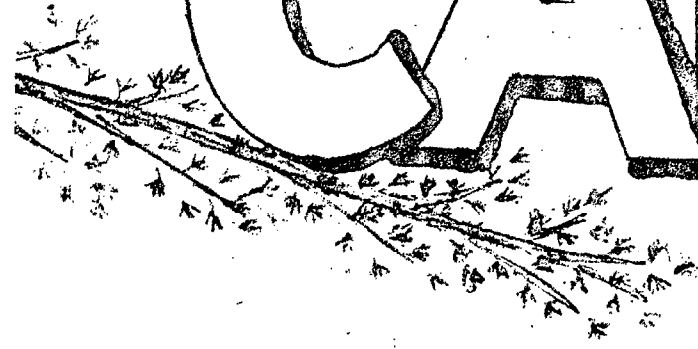

Nineteen-eighty, the first year of a new decade, the commencement of a new era and a time for great change.






A Note From Evy

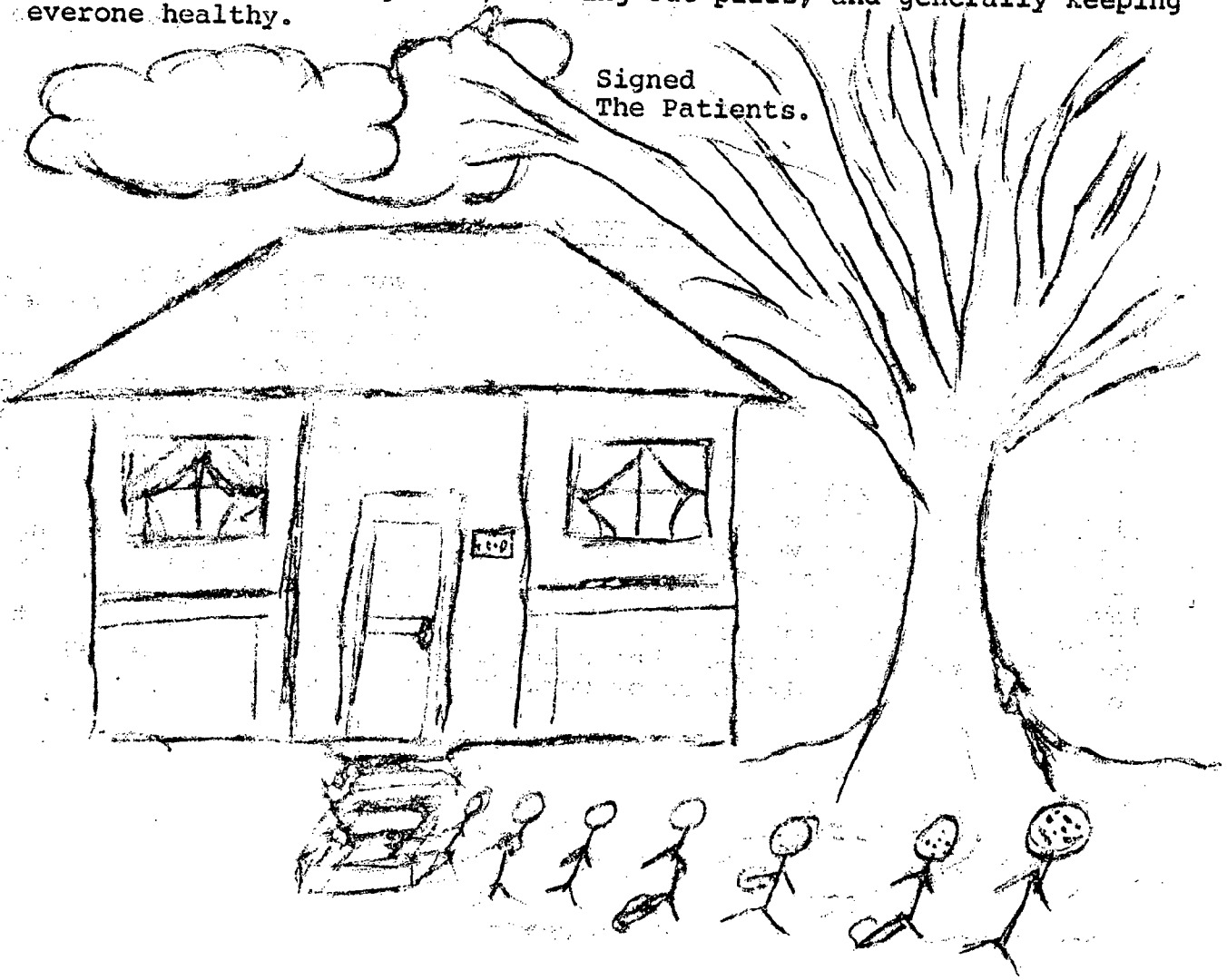

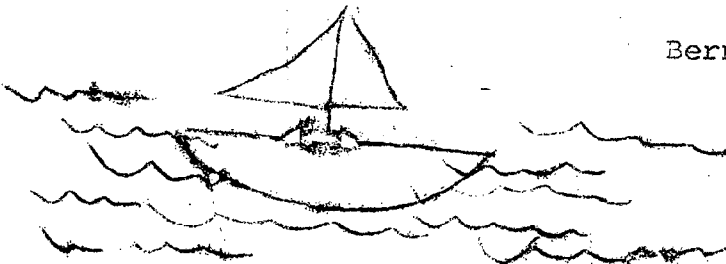

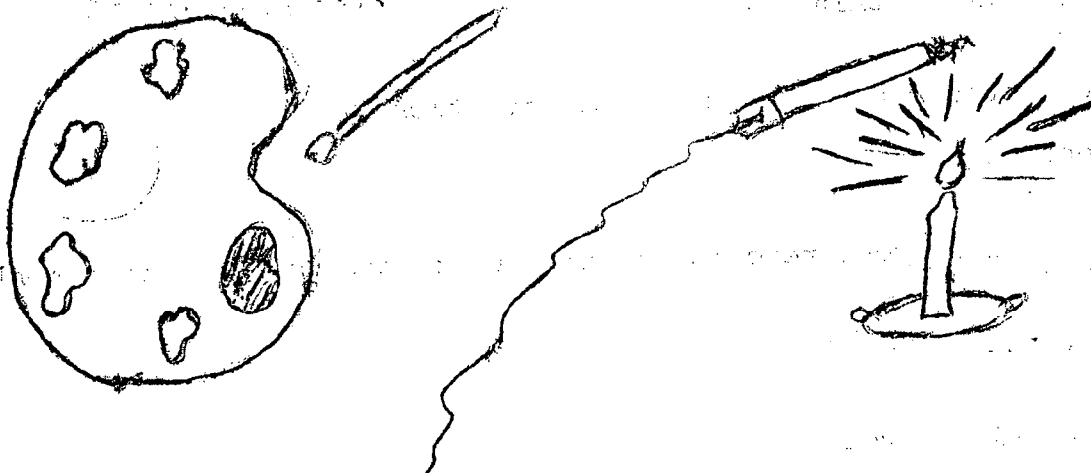
I was very happy to work in the Melechet Yad. I learned how to use many new working materials, and techniques that are not known in Israel. So now I will try to introduce thim to Israel.

Too many to think of.

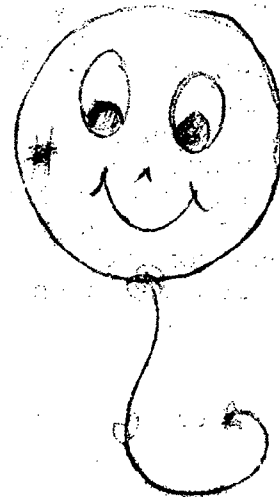
7. How would you sum up the food situation?

5. When you were a camper here, what did you enjoy most about camp?

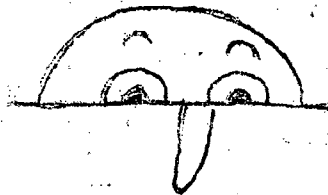
Sleeping.

6. Is there a big difference between being General Staff and Head Staff?

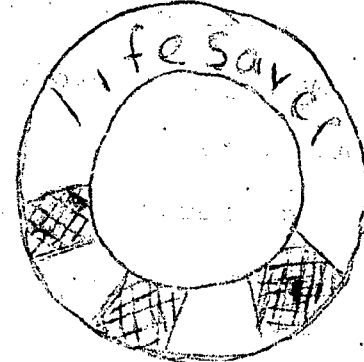
Yes, about an hour, and late night snacks as well on Head Staff themes for the summer such as short and chunky or kvetch and slander.

4. Do some of your students give you a rough time?

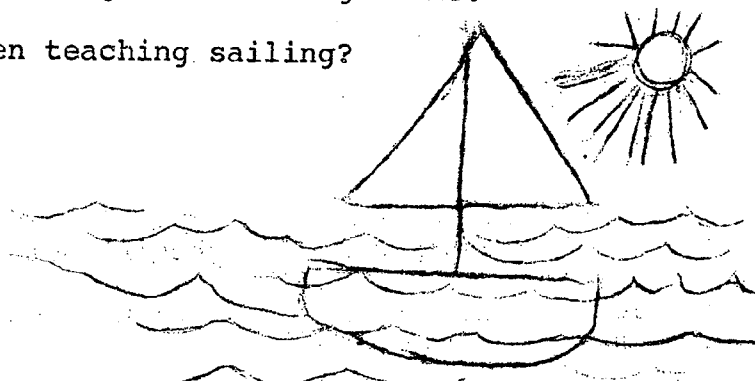
Well not necessarily, but very few give me a rough time.

This was my third year.

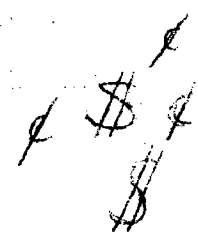
Ron and Marsha

What do you do in Israel?

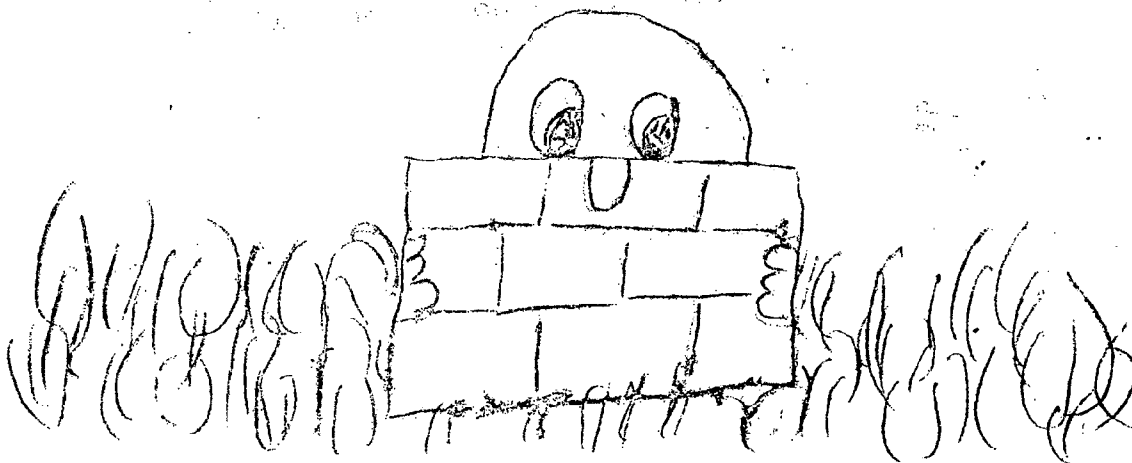
I am studying dance and art therapy in Tel Aviv.

A kiss. "I didn't know that-do you take MasterKiss?"--Jeff Cohen.

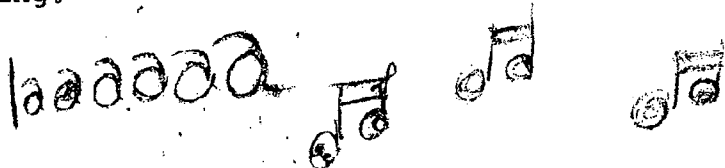
5. Do you write your own songs and which of them have you taught at Kadimah?

Memories are all we have left of this summer, but that's enough, for memories are something we always carry with us. They can never be taken from us and no one can stop us from looking at them. Cherish them always.

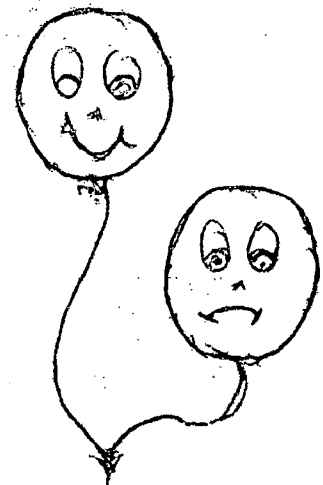

Alot of people thought it was a joke. Then, Bill Eric came knocking on the doors, then we knew it was for real.

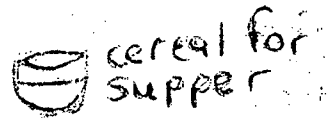

On August fifth at 9:30 in the morning, Camp Machar 1980 left Camp Kadimah for their day off. A day of fun, eating, relaxation, and more eating.

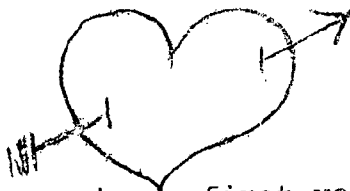

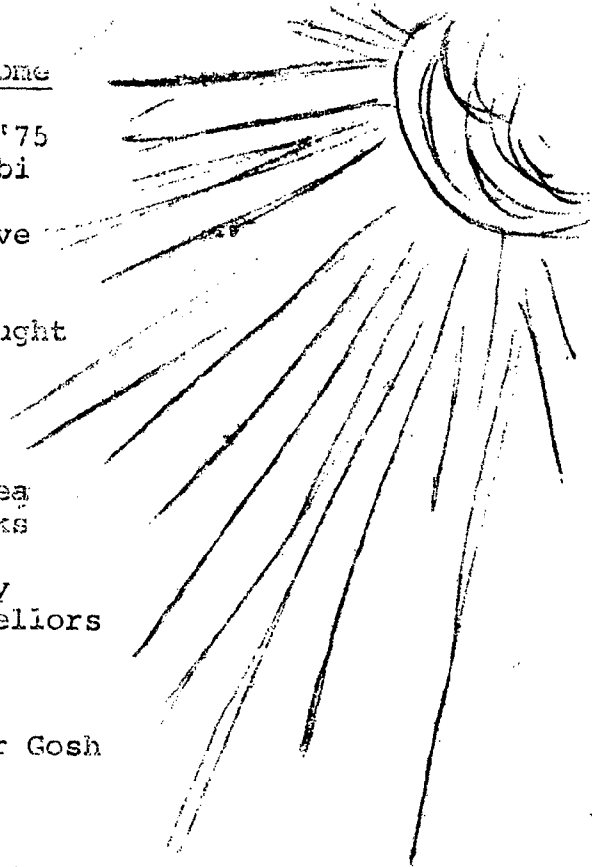

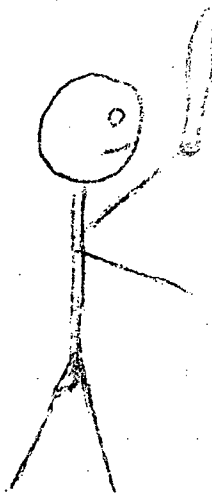
The moment we waited for approaches, the door opens. They look so sure of themselves, so confident, you can tell by Frankie, Mike and Mike's broad smiles.

SAVE PALASHIAN JEWS

There are a group of Jews living in Ethiopia. These Jews are black and have been forgotten in the past by the rest of the Jews. In 1970, there were over 100,000 Palashas. Now, because of assimilation and the government, there are only about 20,000 Falashan Jews left.

The Falashas live in small mud huts with no luxuries such as running water or electricity. They are very poor. Each tribe has a leader who also is the religious leader. WHERE WOULD OUR LOYALTY STAND IF ISRAEL AND NORTH AMERICA BROKE OUT IN WAR?

When considering the hypothetical situation of open conflict between North America and the State of Israel, it can be interesting to imagine the circumstances that would allow such a conflict to take place...

The year is 1986, and the Olympic Games have been beset with a number of seemingly insoluble problems. As far as Israel goes, the tiny Jewish state has boycotted first the 1980 Olympics in Moscow in protest against the Russian invasion of Afghanistan and their violation of human rights. Then in 1984, following President Anderson's admission of the Palestinians into the Middle East peace talks, the Israelis decided to boycott the 1984 Los Angeles Games as well. This of course, infuriated the United States, and the tensions created might very easily have triggered off yet another Middle East war. However, negotiations were earnestly pursued by the Israeli government of Menachem Begin in a desperate effort to remain in power. (At that time the Likud coalition had a majority of the seat in the Knesset.) The result was an American economic boycott of Jaffa oranges.

For the 1986 Olympics, the site of Tel-Aviv was finally chosen after it was noted that the Olympic Stadium in Montreal had still not been completed. The choice of that particular site caused immediate problems. For one thing, the United States and the USSR both made the decision to boycott the Olympics, because of the Israeli boycotts of previous Games. Secondly, the two superpowers found that they now had enough in common to sign a new treaty, which was to become known as T.U.S.A.S.U.A.I. - Treaty of the United States and the Soviet Union Against Israel. And the obvious next step, when Americans began a clamorous call for Jaffa oranges, was the outbreak of hostilities.

Well, the year isn't 1986, and a war between the "Guardian of Democracy in the West" and the only democracy in the Middle East remains nothing more than a remote possibility. As Jews in the Gault, of course we should think of ourselves as exiles from our homeland, and our first loyalty should always remain with the State of Israel.

The point is that for that kind of confrontation to take place, such unthinkable changes would have to take place in one country or the other, that it would become perfectly obvious where our loyalties should lie.

"Who am I to end 5000 Years of History" - Elie Weisel

In the wake of the Nazi Holocaust my parents emigrated from Europe to North America. North America meant religious freedom, it meant that their children and grandchildren could live freely as Jews. The ability to live comfortably as Jews was a prerequisite for moving to North America. As long as that prerequisite exists I will be loyal to my country. If that prerequisite disappears, as it would in a war against Israel, then I will be loyal to my people.

Jews have fought for thousands of years for the right to survive. They had no choice, victory meant survival defeat meant extinction. If North America were victorious in a war against Israel, the Jewish people would cease to exist. It would be a deathblow both to Israeli Jews and to North American Jews.

The singlemost important part of my life is being Jewish, and the singlemost important aspect of the Jewish world is Israel. Any major decision I make is based accordingly.

I could not, in good conscience, fight against Israel, I could not sit passively by. My loyalty goes to my people. I will not contribute to the end of Jewish history.

I am a Canadian for one reason. I happened to be born on a part of the world referred to as Canada. I am North American by demography. I am Jewish by birth, by religion, by history, by culture and by spirit. Not fighting for North America does not mean I am a North American traitor, it means I am an Israeli patriot, I am a ZIONIST. In the same way that Jews speak up politically in favour of the state of Israel, even against the views of their country, I would stand up militarily for my people - Israel.

For 2000 years, Jews have strived to return to Zion. We have fought too many people and known too much hardship. The very idea of some Jews fighting against other Jews is repugnant to Judaism.

Israel and the Galut are, at present, mutually dependent. They both need each other to exist. If one ceases to support the other, both will stagnate. If one actively attacks the other, both will die. Israel has fought all her wars with her back to the sea. Israel knows there is no retreat. I realize that as a Jew and a Zionist, my loyalty lies with my people. I will not aid the destruction of my people.

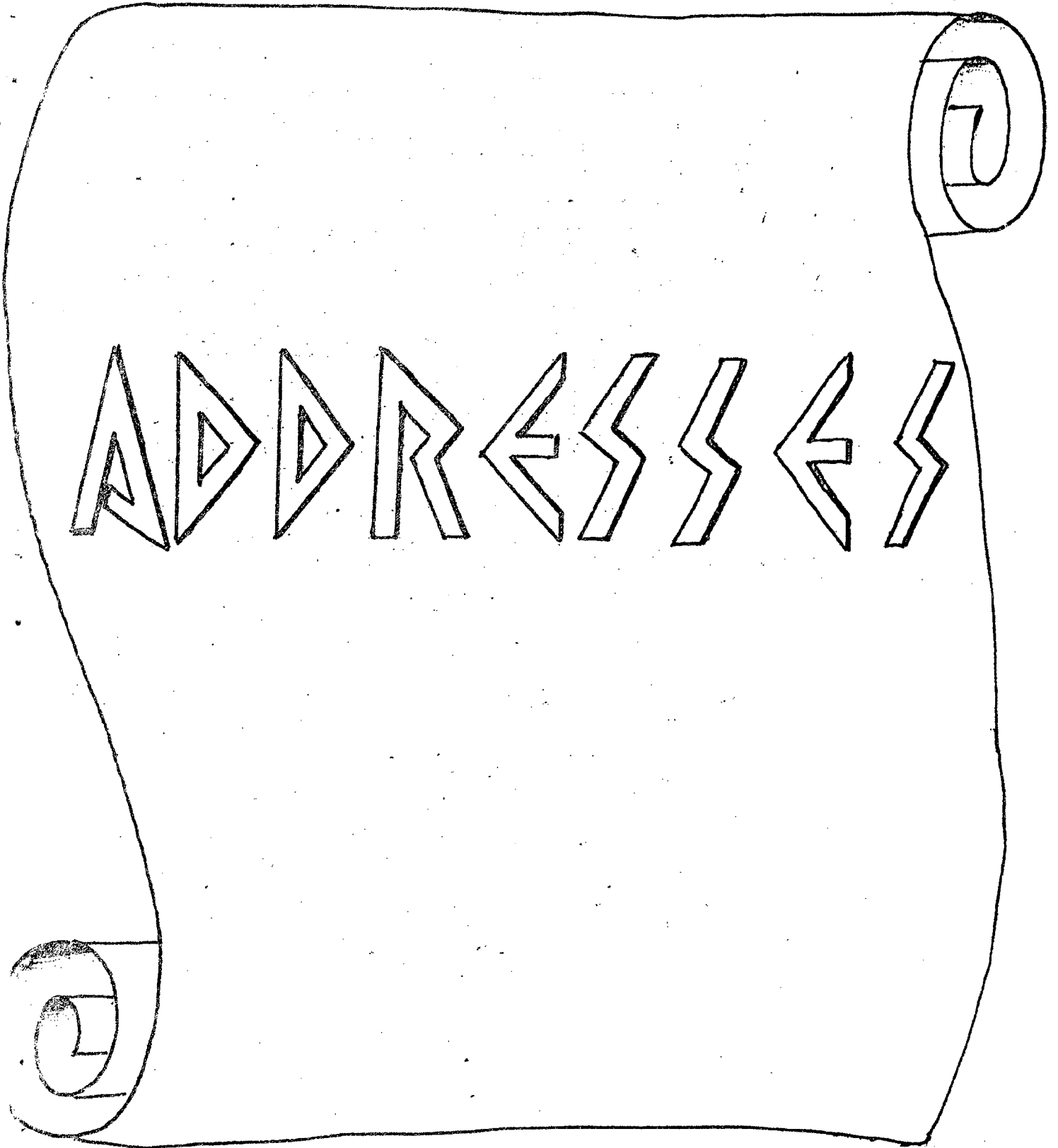

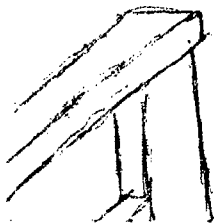
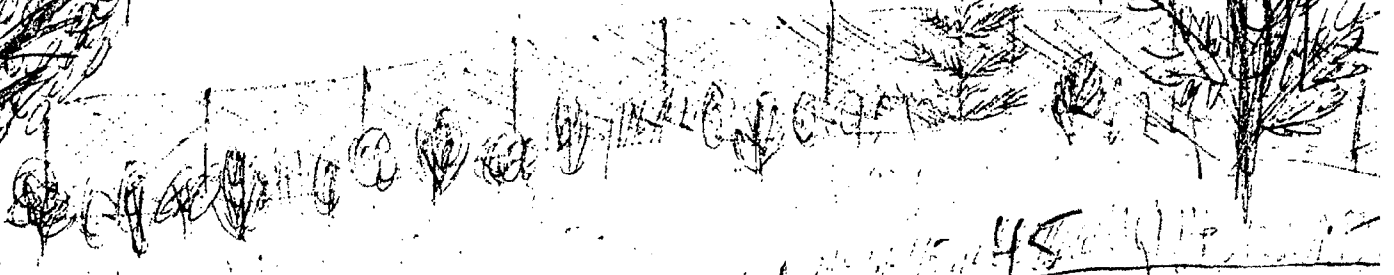
