

And then Maccabia, with it's challanges and team spirit! And the Infirmary with its salt gargles and throat lozenges and foot sores and aspirines for headaches and any other part that ached. I havent even mentioned those rainy days and those sleepy people who nooded off, waiting patiently for their young charges to be examined and cleared for swimming and various other popular activities. So here it is -- my brief report on business in the Infirmary for 1982. Now that I finally got started, how do I end? Perhaps I should mention that I'm a dog for punishment (no reference to Kenny meant here) and that the same time next year could very well find me sitting here, trying to write another report.

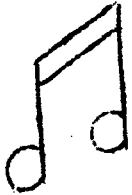

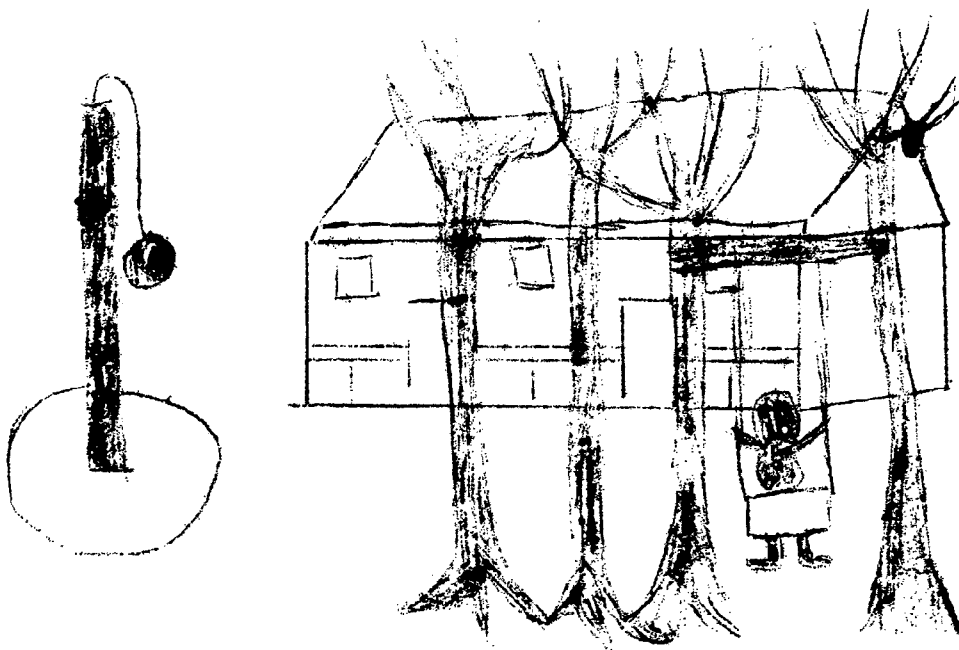
Now that the summer is over you may be far away from your "second home" but your friendships and memories will remain in your hearts to cherish. The summer may be over, but your memories will last forever.

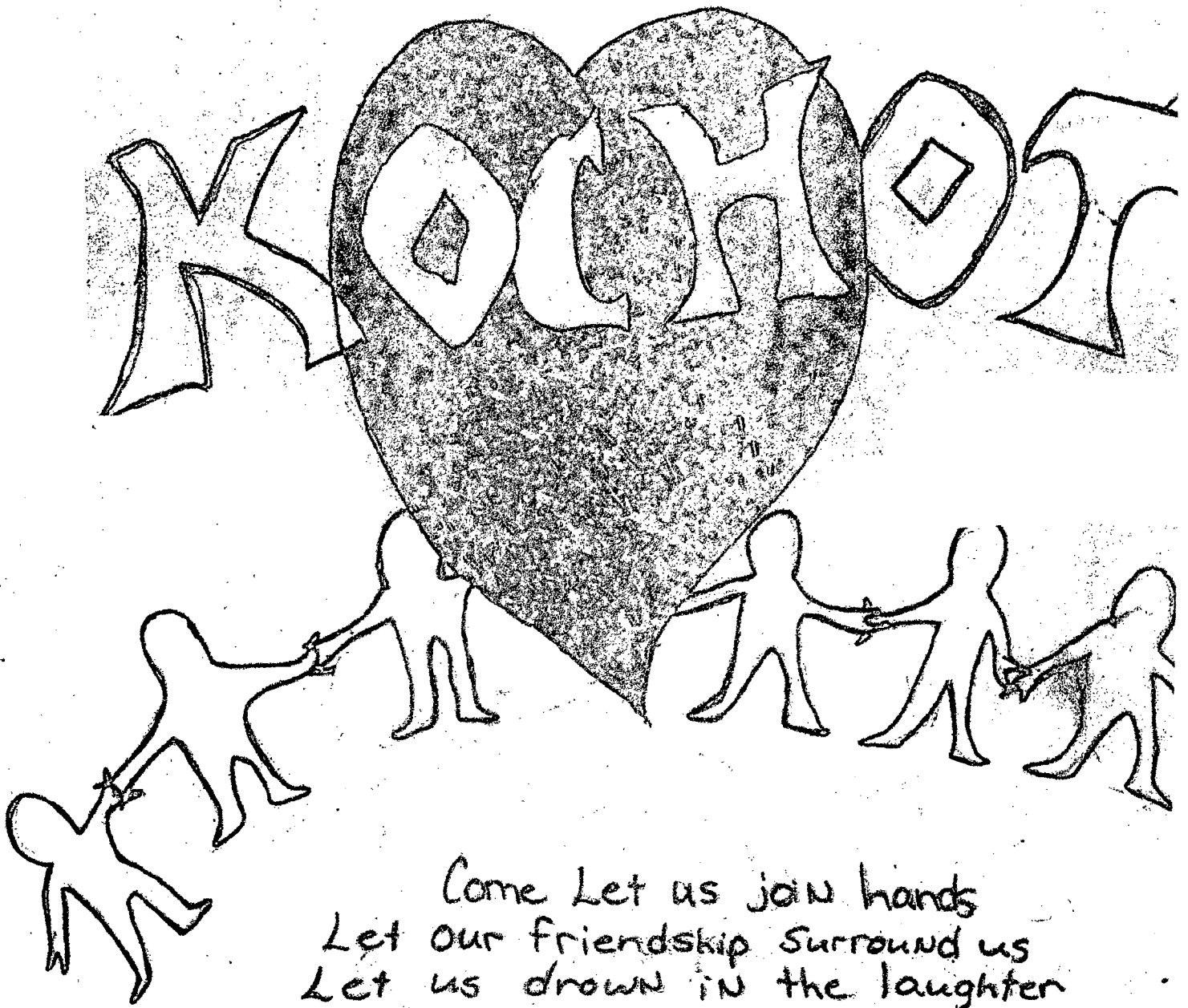

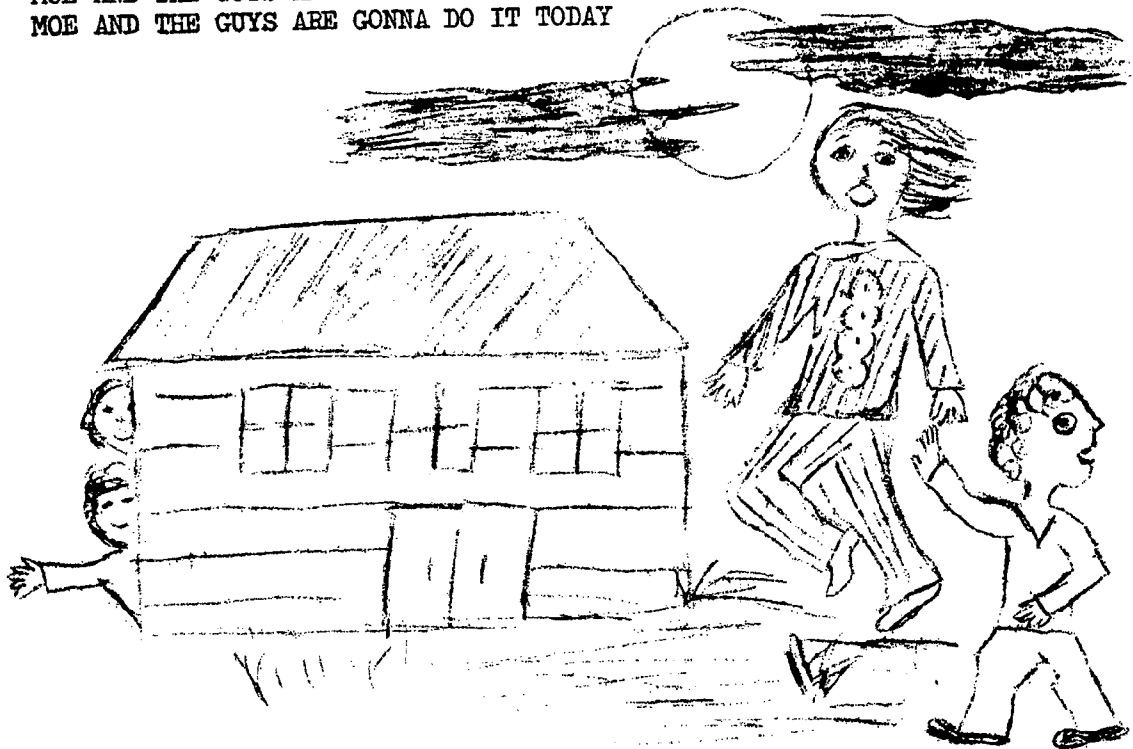

Sheldon says I have to write a section report but I say no, I'll write a section report.

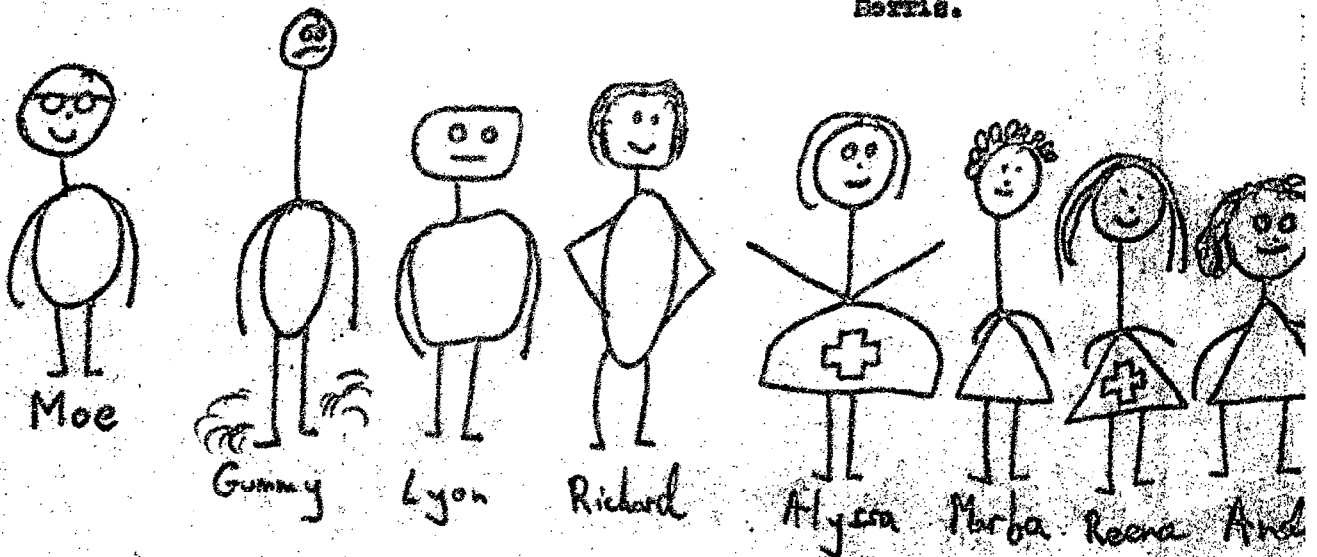
