MESSAGE FROM ORNA AND JUDI

It's the first time that we took part in Camp Kadimah, We as Israelis would like to share our feelings which we have experienced throughout the camp season. Some of the activities reminded us of Israel, and because of this we were able to smile from time to time. For example, let us describe the bonfires we had at camp with respect to the bonfires we have in Israel.

First we have to walk approximately 10 minutes to get to the bonfire site (10 min. is the minimum amount of time that we must walk in order that the site isn't too close to camp). Furthermore, the majority sit around the fire on various pieces of logs, instead of on the ground. The fire itself is set in the center of a circle surrounded by a wall of stones that God forbid the fire won't spread and catch with the wet grass which was left after the rain.

After everyone is seated, each person then gathers their own branch in order to roast marshmallows. In the midst of the darkness, all that can be seen is white tipped branches constantly entering and leaving the fire, along with a great amount of noise. From the swallowing of the marshmallows to the loudness of the tape music. In addition, once the bonfire has commenced there are various attempts at singing songs. One song is rarely completed either because not everyone is familiar with the words or plainly because everyone is busy eating.

After a final ghost story has been told, the time has come to put the fire out. At least an hour must be wasted with constant flooding of bucket of water and sand. The fire is put out now that's for sure. Then comes the time for sleep-but to no avail for the campers are usually awake bright and early at 5:00a.m. singing and cheering no doubt to spite the sleeping staff.

On the other hand, in Israel it's quite different. First of all, it takes approximately a half an hour to gather enough wood to make a fire. For in Israel there isn't a great amount of wood as there is in Canada. Furthermore, the bonfire is made on camp grounds and everyone is seated around the fire on the ground. An Israeli bonfire first begins with quiet hebrew songs never any taperecorders. There are usually instruments such as guitars or accordians. The food eaten usually consists of baked potatoes and onions. In Israel the fire is extinguished with pails of sand and stones. When everyone is finally asleep we all know what took place in the morning.

Nevertheless, some of the activities we do in Canada are similar to those in Israel, such as the prayers and songs which are definitely items which form a tie amongst the Jews in Canada and those in Israel.

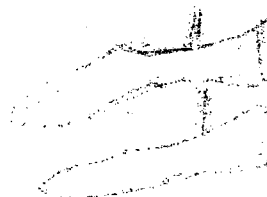
SHIRA AND RIKUD: by Orna


MACHAR DAY

and bears are enough to scare the _____ out of us.




Before I came to camp, not having been brought up in a religious home, I had never heard of Tisha B'av. Here I learned of it and along with it the customs that are followed on this day.
