The campaign went off to an early start wednesday when shalked up General Zionist slogans appeared at strategic spots on the campus. The afternoon of election day began with a grand parade in thich the General Zionists distinguished themselves with a large number of attractive and forceful placerds.

Before a large audience of visitors and voters, the candidates introduced by their campaign managers, Sid Tobin of the Generals, Don Harris of Labour, Joe Levison of the Revisionists and Myer landelson of Mizrachi, eloquently presented the platform and principles of their parties for the approval of the electorate. This part of the campaign was marked by Iris Cappell's sincerity, buth Newmans very fine platform style, the firs of Louis Green-John's oratory and Eddie Cohen's reasoned and high-spirited rements.
