And finally, most important, the campers, who with their spirit and intensity have made this a most memorable summer.


So as I take my leave of camp, one last time, chairs up, chofshee.



To all the councelling staff-who were always willing to sacrifice their experience in hiking to help weak old Gary carry the supplies.


Most of all to Gary and his weak universal joint-thout whose help&fortitude our hikes would have starved.

ARE we going across the bridge today? CAN we sketch the waterffont? This is too hard to do! May I pose?



WATERSKIING '73


Instead of writing a formal-type article, I have chosen to present what I consider to be the highlights of this year's waterskiing chugim and peulot.

- -not mentioning any names, many of our Kadimah skiers have great potential and capabilities.



And last but not least, we interviewed our counsellors, and here is what they had to say Felice Cohen - "Seeing my campers enjoy themselves and having a good time with them."




COUNCIDE COUNSELLORS

Both teams did very well with only a 16 point difference.




MEL YAD REPORT

A visual display would be a more appropriate means of summarizing this summer's malachet-yad program than this short article. But seeing as I'm confined to a small space in this yearbook, I'll try to put my feelings about the peula into words. Ideally, mel yad is a tool in an individual's creative development as well as a means of releasing the built-up pressures and conflicts stimulated by camp program and enviroment. Because of the concentrations and responsibility demanded of the chanichim (to various degrees) in the course of the daily program at Machar, melyad is most instrument al in maintaing a balanced schedule of activities and a balanced state of mind for each individual. This summer I have attempted to liberate melyad from the confines of a structurel, instructional hour-long period. I offered a variety of projects which utilized both arts and crafts materials-from sketching and water color compositions to macrame and basketry. The opportunity to heighten artistic creativity as well as to actually develop certain more taditional cuafts was there for anyone who was motivated positively toward participating regular programming days was smaller than would have been ideal for those who wanted to get more involved in melyad projects. As a result, some people never got past their baskets----while others whose machlekot seemed to have melyad 3 days out of every 5 moved from . ? one project to the next fairly quickly. Despite limited time- I was fairly satisfied with the program as a whole. Not many chanichim have concrete results from the peu to take home with them----but all the same it was at least a tolerable activity for most and I infer it was really enjoyed by some.




The whole program was cuite good except for one point-it was very boring for the spectators who weren't chosen to participate.

(Setting) A relatively hot day at Camp Kadimah. Debbie comes skipping for joy down to the office-


Debbie: Oh, I'm so happy, Nitzi.




