





now you play the g ame.





The lap swimming and daily dipper programmes also met with success this summer (meet the



Thank you for listening. you made the summer fun for us, too. Marcus Brian Rachelle Beth Pam Matthew Howard.



B'Hatzlacha to all of you and thanks again for the terrific


