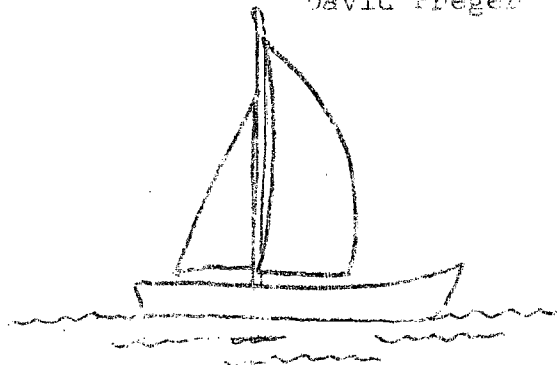
Sail On ... (with Eilam, Ya'acov and Dave) #1

I hope the feelings I'm leaving within you are as strong as the feelings that I'm leaving with.

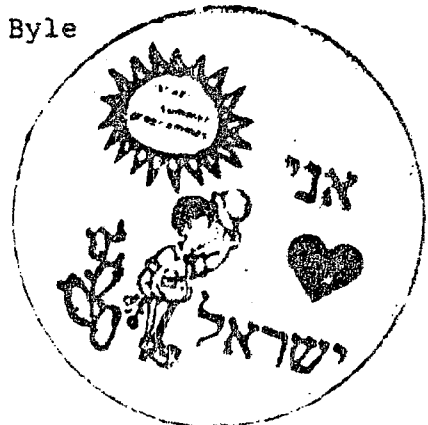
